

## MOORING PLACES ON THE BCN BIRMINGHAM CITY CENTRE

There are many excellent visitor moorings  
Barclaycard Arena, National Sealife Centre & Oozells Street loop.  
Between the Worcester Bar and Holliday Street Bridge.  
Cambrian Wharf and Gas Street basin visitor moorings.  
PUBS: Many to choose from, but the "Prince of Wales" (beside  
the ICC, on Cambridge Street) is a boaters' favourite.

### BIRMINGHAM & FAZELEY

Farmers Bridge top lock & Cambrian Wharf.  
Aston Business Park (offside between Locks 8 & 9  
on Aston flight). **P K**  
Cuckoo Wharf – at the bottom of Aston flight near Salford  
Junction.

North of Curdworth Tunnel  
PUBS: "Dog & Doublet" (between Curdworth locks 8 & 9)

### DIGBETH BRANCH B&F

Near Aston Science Park at top of Ashted Locks.  
Typhoo Basin. (No outside access after hours)

### NEW MAIN LINE

Near Engine Branch Aqueduct, Smethwick.  
A few quiet spots in Galton Valley north of Galton Bridge.  
Coseley Stop (south of tunnel).  
Wolverhampton (near Broad St basin).  
Wolverhampton Top Lock.  
Dunstall Racecourse (between Locks 17 & 18)

### OLD MAIN LINE & LOOPS

Sherborne Wharf Marina (payment needed) **P K**  
Hockley Port visitor moorings **K**  
Engine Arm (Outside Galton Valley Centre).  
Handsworth Wharf end of Engine Arm **K**  
Smethwick Pump House (Offside) **K**  
Whimsey Bridge, Oldbury (next to Mecca complex).  
Valencia Wharf (No outside access after hours) **P K**  
Tividale Quays to Tipton Junction.  
Black Country Museum **K**  
Coronation Gardens, Tipton.  
PUBS: Oldbury "Wagon & Horses" & "The Hardy"  
Tividale "The Boat" & "The Wonder"  
Tipton "The Pie Factory" & "The Fountain"  
Wolverhampton centre - many to choose from, but the  
"Great Western" on Sun Street is a boaters' favourite.

### WEDNESBURY OLD CANAL (RIDGEACRE BRANCH)

Navigation is now difficult or impossible because of weeds.  
C&RT have asked boaters not to try, because of the fish  
deaths

## WEDENSBUURY OAK LOOP

C&RT Workshop basin. Mooring has been permitted, by prior  
arrangement – particularly in association with their open days.  
Check with the workshop.

### TAME VALLEY CANAL

Between Lock No.11 & No.12 adjacent to park and container base.  
Good stretch between M6 and Lock No.7.  
Perry Barr Top Lock.  
PUBS: "Boars Head" on College Road above  
Perry Barr Lock No.11.

### DAW END BRANCH & RUSHALL

Longwood Boat Club towpath side  
or on club moorings by arrangement.  
Outside the "Manor Arms"  
Near "Park Lime Pits" nature reserve.  
Aldridge Wharf (Daw End Visitor Moorings)  
PUBS: "The Manor Arms"  
"The Bell (North East of Bell Bridge)

### ANGLESEY BRANCH

Ogley Junction  
Anglesey Basin  
PUBS: "The Anchor" (just north of Catshill Junction).

### CANNOCK EXTENSION

Selected quiet spots along the entire length of this mostly rural stretch but  
moorings recommended at Grove Colliery Basin and Norton Canes  
terminus.  
PUBS: "The Turf" (50yds from terminus on A5 Watling Street).

### WYRLEY & ESSINGTON

Lane Head Bridge **K**  
Holly Bank Basin  
Sneyd Wharf visitor mooring.  
Pelsall Common (one of prettiest locations on the BCN)  
depth is greatest adjacent to the "Finger Post".  
Brownhills close to Tesco  
PUBS: "Finger Post" (York's Foundry Bridge)

### TITFORD CANAL

Titford Pump House visitor mooring  
Opposite Langley Maltings.  
Titford Pools (v shallow adjacent to towpath)  
Jarvis Bridge (Adjacent to "New Navigation")  
PUBS: "New Navigation" (Jarvis Bridge)  
"Crosswells" (Langley town centre).

## WALSALL CANAL

Walsall Locks Top Lock, off side **K**  
Walsall Town Arm secure off side before town basin.  
Walsall Town Basin  
Willingsworth Hall Bridge (adjacent to Patent Shaft site).  
Ocker Hill moorings (just inside arm) **K**  
Top of Ryders Green Locks. (off side)  
PUBS: "New Navigation" (Walsall Top Lock);  
"Eight Locks" (Ryders Green Top Lock).

### DUDLEY NO.1 CANAL

Black Country Museum end of Dudley Tunnel **K**  
Parkhead end of the Dudley Tunnel  
Some quiet spots between Parkhead and Woodside Bridge.  
Waterfront (Merry Hill) – moorings on hotel side of basin.  
Merry Hill on the embankment (South of Waterfront  
Delph flight (Arm adjacent to Bottom Lock).  
PUBS: "The Woodside" (off Woodside Bridge). A lot of choice  
at Merry Hill's Waterfront development and a real ale fan's  
paradise at the bottom of the Delph flight.  
Try the "Bull & Bladder"; "Black Horse" or "Tenth Lock".

### DUDLEY NO.2 CANAL

Hawne Basin. **P K**  
Windmill End Junction  
Withymoore Island **P K**  
Some quiet spots between Blackbrook and Parkhead.  
Parkhead Junction

## BIRMINGHAM CANAL NAVIGATIONS SOCIETY MOORINGS & FACILITIES ON THE BCN

The Birmingham Canal Navigations (BCN) is a 100 mile network of narrow canals situated at the very heart of the Midlands waterway system.

Unfortunately, the BCN harbours a serious burden – its image. To the uninitiated the BCN is still perceived as grimy and unpleasant, but this is simply no longer true.

Admittedly, some parts do pass through industrialised areas – but remember – that is the reason they were built in the first place!

There are others parts which have returned to rural and are quite beautiful. Nowhere is this more apparent than the delightful areas of the Northern BCN, which provides many miles of tranquil, trouble-free cruising.

Fortunately the Canals & Rivers Trust (C&RT) in conjunction with local councils, ourselves and other canal societies, have done much to enhance the waterside, to improve navigation and to promote the BCN as a valuable leisure resource.

We hope that this brief introduction to the available moorings and facilities will serve to stimulate those unfamiliar with the area to visit, and encourage those with preconceived notions to reconsider.

There is much more than can be conveyed by words alone and the only path to true enlightenment lies with personal experience.

Come and take a fresh look at the Birmingham Canal Navigations – you may be surprised!

### NOTES

These are moorings that society members have found to be safe – but this is not a guarantee.

Any decision as to where you moor your boat must be your own.

**P** shows privately run moorings, where the owners welcome visiting boats.

**K** means you need a key to get out. This may not be a C&RT key, and your only exit maybe to find a keyholder. Details on website.
